Guidance: ALSC


- Consider that accompanying frustrations and outlets are needed.
 - Emotional
 - Behavioral
- Allow relationship building during programming

- > Clear signage & icons
- > Omit underlining and all caps
- > Seating at easy read area
 - Reading area

Using What You Have: What to look for in books

- "Many pictures
- Straight left margin / no right margin (justify left and ragged right) promotes readability
- Avoid text written in blocks
- Additional aides including: a personal computer equipped with a spell checker/ dictionary, reading pens, magnifying rulers and special glasses, and dyslexia software."

Braille System Basics

TYPES

- Grade 1, Alphabetic
 - AKA Uncontracted Braille
 - Beginner, All words-letter by letter
 - Lots of Paper
- > Grade 2, Literacy
 - AKA Contracted Braille
 - Increases reading speed and uses less space
 - Letters, numbers, abbreviations, punctuation, and formatting
 - Contractions

SPECIALIZED BRAILLE

- > Nemeth: math and science
- > Music
- > UEB: Unified English Braille

We do this by providing:

- Instructional materials of braille and large type textbooks, library books and educational aids for loan to teacher for use by students with visual impairments
- Braille transcription of educational materials
- Continuing Education and professional development opportunities for teachers
- Kansas Deaf-Blind library of professional materials for loan to parents, families and professionals
- Adaptive equipment for loan/lease to local school districts for use by Kansas students




